I look forward to sharing many exciting learning events and celebrating our children's wonderful accomplishments throughout the year.


Professional Development:

School session times for 2025 are as follows:

Supervision commences at 8am in the multi purpose area (MPA) and the Prep area at 8:15am.

Families are asked to pack a healthy snack for their child which is had during 'Brain Break' at 10am each day.

School concludes at 3pm.

Children are supervised until 3.30 pm in our MPA. If parents are not waiting outside the classroom, students are to move to the MPA for supervision.

The Barracuda carpark (closest to the oval) is designated for parents who leave their car to walk into the school to collect their child/ren. This is not a designated waiting area for students.

We request that parents/carers notify the school if they will be late in collecting their children.

2025 Instrumental Music Program

Instrumental teachers will contact families prior to your child's lessons with dates, times and a list of what they will need.

Lessons offered are as follows:-

- Strings Mrs Kate Ellis (Years 2-6) (Prep / Year 1 Parents need to attend these lessons)
- Vocal Mrs Ursula Boyd/Mrs Kate Ellis (Years 2 6 only)
- Acoustic Guitar Mrs Jane Bacon (Years 4 6 only)
- Piano Caitlin Seymour (Years 2-6 only)
- Drums Ensemble Judy Carling (Years 2-6 only)
- Drum Kit lessons Judy Carling (3-6 only)

Children may enrol in one instrumental music lesson during class time; a second instrumental lesson will depend on the availability of lessons before/after school and during lunch times.

A levy of \$15 for a child or \$30 per family will be charged on the Term 2 school fees account upon acceptance. This fee offsets all operational costs incurred by the instrumental music program. Instrumental Teachers will issue the individual invoices and payment will need to be made directly to Instrumental Teacher.

Group lessons cost \$20 (half hour). Students need to purchase their own musical instruments. Acceptance into the program depends upon the availability of rooms and teachers. Students reenrolling will be given first preference. In some cases, students may need to be placed on a waiting list. If you wish for your child to be involved in our instrumental program and have not completed the Google form, please complete this online 2025 Instrumental Music Form no later than 9am Thursday 6th February 2025, to be considered for this program.

Please note that some Instrumental lessons offered are at capacity and your instrumental selection may not be available.

The representative school sport permission details booklet (consent form) has the required documentation that schools/district/regions need for students to participate in trials. The form, once completed, is to be handed to our school to be signed by Mrs Kenny or Mrs Collins. The forms which need to be submitted at the trial will be returned to the student.

We encourage you where possible to fill the form out electronically to assist with the eligibility and accuracy of the documents, however, handwritten copies are acceptable.

All permission booklets need to be submitted to the school no later than 4 days prior to the trial to allow time for signing and associated paperwork. Students will not be permitted to trial on the day without the completed consent forms.

Volunteer Induction

Visitor Induction will be held in our staffroom Monday 10th February from 8:45am and Wednesday 12th February from 3:10pm for any parents, grandparents or carers who wish to volunteer at Sacred Heart this year. The induction needs to be completed annually.

This training is a mandatory requirement before any volunteers are permitted to assist. This includes helpers in the tuckshop, which will begin next week. Thank you for your anticipated support.

Daniel Morcombe Child Safety Curriculum

The Daniel Morcombe Child Safety Curriculum will be taught in all classes in Term 1. The link to the website is <u>https://danielmorcombe.com.au/</u>

The Curriculum is based on three key messages: Recognise, React and Report.

The Recognise message encourages students to be aware of their surroundings and to recognise warning clues.

The React message helps students to consider choices that may keep them safe or help make them safe again as quickly as possible.

The Report message encourages students to report unsafe incidents to an adult.

Teachers use various materials, including interactive whiteboard activities, worksheets and safety books, to deliver the Recognise, React and Report messages.

Developmentally appropriate scenarios are also used to explore and discuss safety situations that children may encounter at home, school or their environment.

Students are encouraged to share the resources they complete in class with their families to help keep parents/carers informed about the content being discussed and to promote discussion about safety at home.

The Use of Our School Oval After Hours

Sacred Heart families are most welcome to use our oval to train teams after school.

The guidelines for this are:

- A team representative to contact the office to make an oval booking.
- Children including siblings are supervised by an adult at these times.
- No pets on school grounds.
- Year 1/2 toilets closest to the oval are not used, as these are for the Outside School Hours Care facility, only.

Administration of Medication

All medication needs to have a doctor's or chemist's label attached. Medication is administered by our office staff, who all hold current First Aid certificates.
