Whether parents remain together or not, the way the father continues his role through a young person's important developmental years has a strong influence on life success.

Girls who have a father who regularly praises them for who they are and compliments them on their appearance, have much lower rates of bulimia and anorexia.

Households where fathers 'set the limits' have much lower rates of teenage underage drinking, promiscuity and drug use. Research also reveals, fathers who develop parent-child relationships based on positive interaction, create calmer, more confident children who laugh more.

Compared to fathers of the past, today's father tends to be actively involved in their child's lives and have higher rates of affection and positive physical contact.

It's a big job.

A job with no 'how to manual', as you master one child, the next in line may be totally different.

Fatherhood is a great responsibility but can bring great reward.

We wish all our wonderful dads a Happy Father's Day and hope this Sunday is an occasion which reminds families how great dads really are.

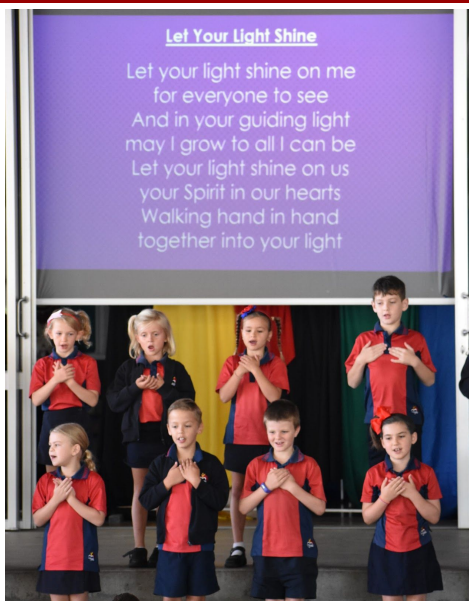


